## **Ideas for Serving Others**

Collect coats and blankets to give to the Samaritan Community Center.
Clean the yard and rake the leaves of an elderly neighbor.
Volunteer to be a one-on-one tutor for a young lady at Saving Grace NWA
Push stray carts to the designated areas in a supermarket parking lot.
Send Christmas cards to military personnel serving overseas.
Volunteer for a few hours at the Rogers Humane Society for Animals.
Go caroling at a local hospital, nursing home or retirement community.
Volunteer to help prepare/share a meal with men of Soul's Harbor NWA.
Donate time to babysit for a couple who needs a date night.
Collect personal items and baby necessities for the NWA Women's Shelte
Volunteer to spend 'quality time' playing video games with a child at NWA Children's Shelter.
Give a gift card to someone for gas, groceries or a restaurant.
Take the time to teach someone something that you know how to do.
Go out of your way to talk to the janitors and cleaning people who most people overlook.
Have your class/small group bring lunch to your workplace once a month.
Ask the HOA or apartment super if there is anything you can do to help.
Volunteer at the Rogers Public Library to help during Children's Storytime
Leave a 'Thank You' card (and a treat) in your mailbox for the mail carrier.
Pick a few restaurants to frequent getting to know the staff and regulars-
be sure to tip generously.
Offer your 'handyman' services to your elderly neighbors.
Make a habit of taking a pre-believing co-worker to lunch once a month.
Volunteer to lead a small-group Bible study in the home of a shut-in.
Each of us has a unique talent, use yours in a way to bless someone.
Ask God to direct you to a person who needs a smile, hug, prayer or
friendly phone call.
Bring baked goods to your neighbors or co-workers.
Volunteer at the Rogers Public Library to help with tutoring.
Choose a missionary or ministry and give them a monetary gift.
At your work party this year, talk to the person who looks 'out of place.'
Help your friend with a DIY project.
Handwrite a personal thank you note to someone who has blessed you.
Provide all the necessary grocery items for a family in need for their
