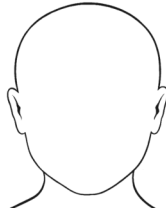

Day One—Sermon Application

In his book, *The Problem of God*, Pastor Mark Clark says, "There is a strange and mysterious design to the cosmos, an anti-randomness, that points strongly to a designer who created and crafted the world with very intentional precision and balance..." Spend some time in nature today. **What are some evidences in nature that point strongly to a Designer/Creator?**

In Romans 2:15, Paul states that all people demonstrate that God's Law is written on the hearts of every person who has ever lived. **What does that mean? What are some of the implications of this truth?**

In Romans 2:4 (NLT), the Bible says, "Don't you see how wonderfully kind, tolerant, and patient God is with you? Does this mean nothing to you? Can't you see that his kindness is intended to turn you from your sin?" **What sin is in your life that you need to turn away from? Are you certain that you know Christ as Savior?**

Day Two—Worship Preparation

Focus today on the lyrics of the song entitled "O Church Arise."

Day Three—Sermon Anticipation

Spend some time this week reading 2 Peter 3. As you are reading, consider this question: **How can an all-loving God punish people with eternal suffering?**

We should not say that God is going to send us to hell—He's not. God has provided an escape from eternal punishment, through His Son, Jesus Christ. Each of us must admit that I am a sinner and I cannot save myself. I must trust in the saving grace of Jesus Christ to receive the free gift of salvation.

Read Romans 3. **Why are people deserving of eternal punishment in hell? What does God provide as an alternative to justice for sin?**
