## **Day One—Sermon Application**

In what ways am I trying to live by the Law and failing? When will I get over trying to appear to be good and admit that my life is just like Paul's description?

What keeps me from going forward to the altar at the end of a sermon? Am I afraid of what someone might think or say? What are some positive things that might happen if I go forward?

## Day Two—Worship Preparation

Next Sunday, we will be singing the song <u>We Believe</u>. Spend some time praying through the lyrics of this song.

We believe in God the Father! We believe in Jesus Christ! We believe in the Holy Spirit! And He's given us new life! We believe in the crucifixion! We believe that He conquered death! We believe in the resurrection! And He's comin' back again! Let the lost be found and the dead be raised! In the here and now, let love invade! Let the church live loud, our God we'll say We believe, we believe! And the gates of hell will not prevail! For the power of God, has torn the veil! Now we know Your love will never fail! We believe, we believe!

Based on our studies of Romans 5-7, what new understanding do you have for the phrase "Let the lost be found and the dead be raised"?

## Day Three—Sermon Anticipation

Read Romans 8:1-13. Who is the Holy Spirit?

Bad theology states that the Holy Spirit is a force that makes you lose control of your body, your mouth and your mind. It causes you to fall into emotionally bizarre and irrational behaviors. That is not the Holy Spirit! John MacArthur explains:

"I don't think we often think about this, but the power exhibited by the Holy Spirit, the power exerted by the Holy Spirit in your life, is a violent power. If you understand your condition before you were saved, you will understand just how violent it was. Dead in trespasses and sin, blind to the truth of God. Profound corruption to the core. Profoundly dead, the walking dead, that's the diagnosis of all human beings before they come to Christ. A violent power comes over the dead and gives it life, and then sanctifying power is released to fight against and overthrow corruption. And one day, that same power will re-create a new you fit for eternal life in heaven. This is amazing power."

**APPLICATION**: Read Romans 8:4 again. **How will this new understanding of the Holy Spirit impact the way you live your life this week?**
