Day Three—Sermon Anticipation

Read the story of Jonah, the great fish and the city of Ninevah in Jonah 1-4.

Jonah is often called the reluctant missionary. He was disobedient, selfish, sinful and had a lousy disposition; and yet God saw fit to use him. The people of Nineveh were proud, and the city was sinking in corruption. The prophet, Nahum, called it "the bloody city, all full of lies and plunder." They were known for their brutality and their cruelty. **So the question is... If God asked you, would you go?**

IN JONAH 4:2, we discover why Jonah did not want to go in the first place. He realized what would happen if he went. The Bryan Taylor translation of that verse says, "If I go to Ninevah, that whole place will repent, so I'm not going!" **Have there ever been times that you felt this way in your own heart about something?**

APPLICATION: Each of us has a Ninevah—a place we do not want to go, but God is calling us to go. **Where is your Ninevah?**
