## Day One—Sermon Application

Jonah thought that the God of Israel would have no power over him, so long as he could get away from Israel. What does the Scripture teach us about the power of God as He sovereignly works in the lives of people?

Read Psalm 139. How does the psalmist describe the presence of God in this passage? Several key terms from verses 1-3 are repeated in verses 23-24. By repeating these ideas, the psalmist is placing great importance upon these ideas. What concepts are repeated and what is God moving you to do in response?

## Day Two—Worship Preparation

Next Sunday, we'll be singing the song *Rescue*. This may be new to some of you. Spend some time praying through these lyrics.

## Day Three—Sermon Anticipation

Spend some time this week reading Jonah 1:17-2:10.

There are three things that I encourage you to look at today:

- 1. This week, we find Jonah in the belly of a great leviathan. Think about that for a minute... It would seem like a hopeless place but Jonah thanks God for his provision. God saved him from certain death. Maybe you're in a difficult situation maybe you are in the belly of a fish—but have you considered that your situation may be God's provision that you need to praise Him for?
- 2. Re-read Jonah 2:1-9. Write down all the ways God is sovereign in verses 1-3. Then write down how Jonah submits to His sovereignty in verses 4-9.
- 3. Matthew Henry stated, "Though we bring our afflictions upon ourselves by our sins, yet, if we pray in humility and godly sincerity, we shall be welcome to the throne of grace, as Jonah was." Spend some time thinking about God's grace!
