

Day One—Sermon Application

There have been many fake theories created over the years to try to disprove the authenticity of the resurrection of Jesus. In this week's message, Pastor Wade addresses several of these fake theories. **Have you ever struggled with believing in the actuality of the resurrection of Christ? What was the reason for your doubt? Are you still struggling with doubts on this issue?**

One of the reasons to believe in the genuineness of the resurrection is because of the large number of witnesses who saw Jesus after He rose from the dead. Another reason to believe is because of the life transformation that has taken place in the lives of so many who claim to follow Christ. **How has believing in Jesus Christ and His resurrection transformed your life? What evidence exists of your personal transformation?**

Day Two—Worship Preparation

Day Three—Sermon Anticipation

In our world today, the ultimate cultural sin is intolerance. At the slightest hint of intolerance, people begin labeling us as racist, sexist, bigots, etc. The idea that “what's true for you is not necessarily true for me” has gained so much popularity that it is accepted as the cultural norm. **Read John 14:1-14. How does Jesus' teaching in verse 6 coincide with the culture's mandate to be tolerant of others and their beliefs?**

How can we hold to the truth that Jesus is the only way to God without being seen as bigoted and narrow-minded?

Read John 13:31-35. Until we are able to go to be with God in heaven, what does He want us to do? Why?
