Day One—Sermon Application

Last week, we were warned to not put God in a box based on past experiences. This week, we were cautioned about our lack of faith and cynicism. **What are some areas in your life where you are not trusting God completely? Consider Proverbs 3:5-6.**

Read Romans 1:16-17. In this passage, Paul explains that the gospel contains the righteousness of God, "revealed from faith for faith." **What does the phrase "from faith for faith" mean? What do you think it means?**

Day Two—Worship Preparation

One of the songs in our worship time next week will be the old hymn "Wherever He Leads I'll Go." Is this a song we can sing with a heart of disobedience?
