I know that this decision goes way beyond the issue of comfortable seating in our sanctuary—the church pews represent a flood of memories

from your past experiences with God in this place. The desire of your pastors is to be sensitive to your concerns; while at the same time, posturing our church for growth in the future!

Currently, our sanctuary space is a dedicated worship space—meaning that it can only be used

for meetings where the focus is on the stage and cannot be reconfigured. The room consists of about 2,500 ft² of

space that is only being used a

few hours every week. If we decide to exchange our existing pews for these "Pew Stacker" chairs, this space will be able to be used for many purposes, such as seminars, or events for children and youth. There are many marked advantages for

moving toward this type of sanctuary seating.

We believe that the purchase of "Pew Stacker" chairs will not only be more comfortable but will also update the look of our auditorium. At some point in the future, we will also need to consider renovating other aspects of the auditorium (i.e. carpet, paint, stage, etc.), but those issues are not prerequisite to the decision to replace the current seating that is on its last legs.

Please prayerfully consider purchasing a chair for each member of your family—and maybe for a visiting family as well!

Who knows but that the person you pour your life into will become the catalyst of redemption and renewal for this needy world.


