Life Experiences

As we set aside time this month to remember the birth of our Savior—Jesus Christ—I invite you to take the time to include this Scripture reading as a part of your Christmas celebration. These words express "the glorious result of the coming of the Christ child to earth. He experienced the manger, the flight to Egypt, the daily suffering of hunger and homelessness, the rejection of the religious authorities, the disloyalty of the disciples, the unjust trial, the cruel death, and the tomb so that you would have what these words express. He came and endured all these things for you and me so that we would have forever what we never could have earned, deserved, or achieved on our own" (Tripp). Romans 8:31-39 says:

³¹ What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³² He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? ³³ Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or

danger, or sword? 36 As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

"Sit in front of your Christmas tree and read these words out loud to your loved ones so that you all will remember what the Christmas story is all about" (Tripp).

God, the Creator of the universe, loves us so much that He willingly

gave His one and only Son to be the perfect sacrifice for the sin of all mankind. What greater love could there ever be?

As we gather together for time with our loved ones this holiday season, let us not forget that we know how to love because He first loved. We have hope for the future because He offers us hope of eternal life. We can enjoy the peace in this life because He offers us peace that goes beyond comprehension. Wednesday night TSM will also be cancelled on December 26th, and will be cancelled on January the 2nd. We will start back on January 5th.





Will Meet at Temple Baptist Church Tuesday, December 11, 2018 Meal at 6:00 - Meeting at 7:00




