It was almost 30 years ago when my father and I went on our first mission trip. We headed south of the border to work with missionaries John Ladd and Ricky Williams in Mexico. That trip had a huge impact on my life. I started to realize that there were millions of people beyond my reach who need the truth of the gospel—and I wanted to be the one to take it to them!

Several years (and two kids) later, God was giving us that very opportunity! He had called us to serve Him abroad, and finally in 2002, the doors opened allowing us to serve the BMAA as missionaries to the Philippines.

Some of you might remember me sharing our vision for ministry and our desire to reach the 50/50 porthole for Christ by equipping Filipino missionaries and church planters to reach all the countries in this window.

God had given us a huge vision for ministry! I spent the next twelve years learning that none of us—no matter how hard I tried—is able to reach the world alone. We need to look beyond our reach and partner together with others to change people's lives.

This is one of the reasons that associational work is important among our churches! Our church may not be able to have an impact for

Christ in a distant land, but when we work together and pool our resources we can have a much greater impact for the gospel.

If making an impact for the gospel all around the world is something you would like to get involved with, I want to encourage you to plan to give a special offering for World Missions Day on February 23, 2020.

Currently, our association has extended its reach to 81 countries, 72 American missionary personnel, and more than 500 #ChangeMaker missionaries planting churches in their home countries. Think about it... would you ever be able to reach someone in the Dodoma Region of Tanzania with the gospel? What about someone living

Those who grieve your passing will greatly appreciate that you have chosen the type and place of the memorial service, designated who should officiate, and purchased the burial plot.

After all we do not know the day nor the hour of our passing from this life to eternity. But we do know that time will soon be here. Unless the Lord returns first we shall all go through the process of death. Are you ready? (Hebrews 9:27)

Studies show that 80% of new year's resolutions have failed by the start of February Personally, I don't put much stock into new year's resolutions, however I do enjoy setting goals for



years at a time and evaluating them as I move closer or further away to what I aim to achieve. Goals have the ability to reveal and make clear our own personal moti-

vation and even our priorities. When goals aren't just personal, but also organizational, they work as a unifying and enabling force.

With this principle in mind, I was curious about what goals were being set for 2020. The most common goals related to physical health and weight loss. By generations, Millennials were more concerned about getting a work promotion or raise as opposed to physical wellness and Gen Z (people born after 1997) are actually more concerned with "finding love".

That discovery amazed me. I don't know that I've ever seen the brokenness of our community and neighbors so well summarized. We want to find love. Those of us who know the good news of Jesus Christ know how readily available this tangible desire is.

So, how do our goals as a church move us in unity toward answering this call? I realize it's a jump and I'm looking at secular surveys from a biblical perspective, but these results imply that 80 % of people who are open to the Gospel haven't heard it by the time February begins.
