Ever have someone say something to you that was so out of character that you almost did not believe it came from them? Or has someone sent you a text that seemed colder or meaner than normal... Only to later find out that the intent of the comment or text was not nearly as offensive as what we perceived it to be?



When you are listening or reading anything that is not the Word of God, there are three things here that are at play that you should consider in all readings or conversations in your life: The Author, The Intent, and Your Perception.

We only know that something is out of character, when we know the character. The most important character that we need to learn is God's. God's characteristics are the only measure by which we can compare our words (digital, written, or spoken) to know if they are Biblical.

The intent of the author is as equally important as who the Author is. When you read a book or listen to a song, just because they use the word "Christian" doesn't mean that the intent or the content is truly Biblical.

As you interact with any person, book or song, ask yourself these three questions: who is the author, what is their intent, and is my perception built on truth?
