Bible Reading: Philippians 1:19-30

Devotional Thought:

To live is Christ, and to die is gain. What do we have to lose as Christians? Nothing in this world matters except what we are doing to point others to Christ. This world is not our home. This life is not our end. Heaven awaits, and in the meantime we have work to do here.

May we never settle for loving this world and all that it has to offer. We are here for a purpose: to glorify God in the here and now.
