

Lesson Text: Genesis 1:1—2:25

#### **Lesson Themes:**

- The triune God created the heavens and the earth. "All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made." (John 1:3)
- In the Bible, light represents good and darkness represents evil.
- The Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the dark waters. God created light which took away the darkness and then created land which calmed the waters.
- Jesus is the light of the world (John 8:12). We can trust in Him and He will take away the sin that consumes our lives with darkness.

## Theme Verse: 1 John 1:5-6

"<sup>5</sup> This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. <sup>6</sup> If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth."

## **Lesson Goal:**

Discover that God—who is light and the Creator of light—can take away the all the darkness that exists in our lives.



Lesson Text: Genesis 3:1-24

#### **Lesson Themes:**

- God created man and woman in His own image (Gen 1:27)—which set them apart from the rest of creation. Not only that, God breathed the breath of life into man (Gen 2:7).
- God created a perfect place for Adam and Eve to live—the Garden of Eden. When God created man, His work was completed because God created man to be His friend.
- The devil was jealous of God and His relationship with Adam and Eve, so he tried to ruin their friendship. Their friendship with God was broken when they sinned (Rom 5:12).
- Their sin revealed their nakedness—they were no longer innocent. They tried to create a covering for their sin, but it was insufficient. So God killed an animal and covered their nakedness with its skin (Heb 9:22).

## Theme Verse: 1 John 1:7-8

"<sup>7</sup> But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. <sup>8</sup> If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

## **Lesson Goal:**

Discover that our sinfulness has separated us from God too—but even though we have been separated from God, He wants to restore our relationship with Him through the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ, by His death on the cross.



Lesson Text: Genesis 6:1ff

#### **Lesson Themes:**

- God was saddened by how sinful mankind had become because every that people thought and everything people did was immoral all the time. (Gen 6:5).
- There was only one man in the whole world who "found favor" in God's eyes—Noah. "Favor" could also be translated as "grace." Grace is God's undeserved favor.
- God punished the sinfulness of man (Rom 3:23) by sending a flood that covered the
  entire earth. He provided a way of salvation from the flood. for Noah, his family and all
  the creatures of the earth. The ark—covered in pitch—kept them safe from the flood.
- The "pitch" which covered the ark and enabled it to float is the same word as "atonement."
   Just as the pitch covered the ark, Jesus' blood covers our sins (Heb 9:22-28).

## Theme Verse: 1 John 1:9-10

"<sup>9</sup> If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <sup>10</sup> If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us."

## **Lesson Goal**:

Discover that God has made a way to restore His relationship with us, and that way is through Jesus Christ alone. If we are not trusting in Him alone, we will stand guilty before God in the coming judgment (Heb 9:27). Today is the day to trust in Jesus as Savior.
