Merry Christmas church family! I hope that this letter finds you well and in good spirits. In Wade's sermon this last week, he spoke about having an accountability partner. It gave me an idea for the month of December. I think that we should each have a "Prayer Partner."

I want to take a moment and make a quick differentiation between an accountability partner and a prayer partner. An accountability partner is not something to go into lightly. This person needs to be of the same sex as you. This person needs to have a strong, personal walk with Jesus.
