But I couldn't shake the feeling that God had placed my name on Billie's heart for a reason and that I needed to seriously consider going. After some prayer and further back and forth in my head, I finally agreed to join his team...a few months later. (Thankfully, he was still hoping I would be a part of the team.)

Then came the next obstacle: Finances. I wasn't as concerned about those because I knew if God was sending me, He would supply the funds to get me there. My only real prayer in this area

was: "God, I'm not a huge fan of fundraising. I'll do it if I have to, but if you really want me to go, would you just provide the funds?" And God graciously honored my request. He has gone above and beyond my expectations and completely funded my trip in large part thanks to your generous support and obedience to the Holy Spirit. (Thank you!)

And so, February 3rd I'll be joining a team of seven other people headed

"What's my motivation?" You might say, "I'm just not motivated." Well, what motivates you?

I heard a speaker recently describe motivation as "doing the thing you want to do." So, what do you find yourself doing? Entertainment? Checking your phone? Hunting? Making money? Work? Are their things you wish you did, but you aren't motivated to do them?

Towards the end of Jesus's life, we find the greatest example of being motivated by the correct thing. When Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane, Matthew 26:39 says "And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, 'My Father, if it be possi-

ble, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will."

Eternal Value of Short-term MISSIONS

Missions and mission trips has been a part of my life for over 30 years now. My first mission trip was in the fall of 1991. My father and I went on a medical/work trip to Central Mexico with Central Baptist Church of Prescott, AR. The work I did on that trip was not life-changing for the people of Mexico, but it sure was for me!

One-and-a-half years later, I spent 10 weeks serving as a VSM (Volunteer Student Missionary) in the Philippines. At that point, I knew that God was calling me to serve Him abroad. It was nine years and two degrees later before I was able to return to that mission field. Throughout our time of waiting, my calling never waned.

During our twelve years serving overseas, we hosted many short-term mission teams and short-term missionaries. We have learned a lot about the do's and don'ts and expectations of these temporary assignments. Here are a few things that we learned.

First Do No Harm

Just like the Hippocratic Oath taken by doctors before they begin practicing medicine, it is essential for the short-term missionary to vow to

not be the cause of long-term difficulties for the host missionary.

Second Mitigate Expectations

Adoniram Judson was a missionary to Burma, what is now known as Myanmar. It took years of faithful service among those people before he was able to see the fruit of his labor. How can we expect to have a tremendous impact on a people group in just a few weeks or months?

Third Expect Great Things from God

Another missionary, William Carey, lived by the mantra: "Expect great things, attempt great things." This may seem like a contradiction to my previous point, but it really isn't. God will always accomplish His work in this world, but sometimes it is difficult for us to understand what that is.

When joining in a short-term mission effort, often the greatest work of God is in the heart and life of the missionary! A softened heart. A changed perspective. A new level of gratitude. These are just a few of the treasures that can be found while serving in short-term missions. Please pray for Rachel and Pastor David as they serve Him in Africa. Pray for God's work to be done!
