We recently started a brief study through the Book of Haggai, and what we're discovering is that the message of God through the Prophet Haggai is still as relevant to us today as it was to the all those living in Jerusalem over 2500 years ago.

Our problem is that we are so consumed with making life more comfortable for ourselves that we do not have time for things like the great commission. I mean... really...

- Who has time to talk about the Lord with people we meet each day?
- Who has time to spend everyday reading, studying and memorizing God's Word?
- Who has time to add yet another thing like a weekly meeting with a mentor to their already overloaded calendar?

I hope that you can see and hear my sarcasm jumping off the page as you read this. It is easy for us to disregard these questions as the fallacy that they are—the problem is that these are the lies we tell ourselves everyday... and we believe every word of it!

The Great Commission—recorded in various forms in all four gospels and the Book of Acts—was Jesus' last command to His followers. If we read Matthew's account, He tells them that as

they are going about their business

day-by-day, they should be focused on doing the work of making disciples. That process includes evangelism, teaching the truth of God's Word and helping people to get connected with a local church family. Every single one

of us share in this responsibility to

carry out the Great Commission of our Lord!

Recently, David had a lesson on sharing your testimony for the youth, and had the youth parents ask their students about that lesson. While we were engaging with Norah (our oldest) about her testimony, it got me thinking "When was the last time I told my Testimony?"

No matter the story or the storyteller, the gift of salvation and the following relationship with God we gain through that salvation experience is never trivial or boring.

John 9 is all about
the blind man being
healed—his testimony and
how people received it. Often times, it's way
easier for us to be "brave" (Romans 1:16) when
things are bad. However, when times are
"goodish to great" we don't want to rock the
boat—the boat of "social norms".

Back in John 9, when the recently healed blind man told his story, they threw him out. Is that what your afraid of? Are you afraid of being thrown out of the group at work, the social group you hang out with? Or are you afraid of a family member who doesn't know Christ?

I wonder what might happen to our day-today decisions if we cared less about our personal discomforts and more about the eternal outcomes of those who don't know Christ.

I encourage all of you to be faithful to share your Testimony to all that will listen.

Cleaning up the garage a box of papers surfaced. Among the contents there was a clipping from a newspaper but undated. The writer spoke fondly of her parents' and grandparents' simple lifestyle. Among other things were listed a homemade recipe for toothpaste. The ingredients were simply unbelievable to my mind but Norma loved it and wanted to try it out.

"It's not realistic! She can't be serious!" I said. It's only there as humor, not to be tried!"

So, Norma emailed the author and within an hour a reply came. The recipe was a good one, of course! And the author wished her well in the effort to convince me.

What does it take to convince you?
God led the nation of Israel through the
Red Sea but weeks later the people
were complaining and talking about
going back to Egypt.

God destroyed the city of Jericho and consistently overcame the enemies of Israel but within a few years they were forgetting Him and worshiping idols!

A motley crew watched from afar as their leader, their master, died on a cross. They knew he was buried and the tomb sealed with a stone. They wondered as three days later he began meeting with them and continued to do so for forty days. After He rose toward the heavens they continued to meet. Soon they were accused of turning the world upside down.

Their descendants continue to share this Good News today. What convinced them? (2 Timothy 1:12)
