> The final reason for this rotation is to cross-train musicians and equip additional musicians. There are a few musicians on our current praise team that play several instruments but have only been able to serve in one capacity. We want to invite them to utilize

more of their talents for Christ, while at the same time inviting others to fill in the gaps.

God has blessed Temple with tremendous musical talent. Consequently, we have a responsibility to shepherd that talent well. With that in mind, we have begun this rotation of rest to honor our musicians and their call to serve God.
