## QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

Read Luke 17:20-25. What type of “kingdom” were the Pharisees expecting the Messiah to set up when He came? How did Jesus refute this idea?

What did Jesus mean when He said the kingdom of God was in their midst? To what (or to whom) is He referring?

Read Matthew 6:33. This verse implies that the kingdom of God is embodied in the righteous Savior, Jesus Christ. How does this help us to understand Luke 17:21?

What event was Jesus predicting here in Luke 17:22 (c.f. John 16:4ff.)

To what is Jesus referring in Luke 17:25? What was the purpose for this rejection and suffering? (c.f. Isaiah 53:3-5; 1 Peter 3:18)

## QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

Read Luke 17:22-37. How does Jesus describe the people who lived in “the days of Noah”? What does this description imply about them and their awareness of spiritual things?

Who else does Jesus describe here in this passage? What does this teach us about the need to be prepared for the Day of the Lord?

What did Lot’s wife do that we are to remember? (c.f. Genesis 19:1-26)  
What does this reveal about her desires and feelings for Sodom and all that it represented?

Read Matthew 16:24-27. How does this passage help us understand Luke 17:33? How should we understand it?

To what day is Jesus referring in verse 31? What will determine who will be taken and who will be left on that day? What was the determining factor in the case of Noah (Genesis 6:5-9; 7:1) and the situation in Sodom (Genesis 18:22ff.)?
